2Basic Seizure First Aid	
 Stay calm & track time Keep child safe Do not restrain Do not put anything in mouth Stay with child until fully conscious Record seizure in log 	A convulsive (tonic-clonic) seizure lasts longer than 5 minutes Student has repeated seizures without regaining consciousness Student sustains a head injury during episode Student has a first-time seizure
For tonic-clonic (grand mal) seizure: Protect head Keep airway open/watch breathing Turn child on side	Student is injured or has diabetes Student has blue/grey color change Student has breathing difficulties Student has a seizure in water
